

Charlevoix Area Zonta Club Announces Rose Day Recipients

Robin Maurer of Charlevoix was recently bestowed the honor of being the annual recipient of Charlevoix Zonta Club's 2017 Zonta Rose Award. A posthumous award was given to the late Annette Nesburg, also of Charlevoix.

The Rose award is presented to a local woman who has provided significant service to women in the community. Maurer is General Manager of Charlevoix's Rainbow Thrift Shoppe (the 'Rainbow Shoppe'), a non-profit organization which funds local outreach and mission projects. During her twenty-seven-year tenure at the Rainbow Shoppe, Maurer has worked tirelessly to provide families in need with the required resources to enhance their daily lives. As well as being actively involved through the Circle of Strength with the American Cancer Society, Maurer and her husband Randy are well known in Charlevoix, and are willing volunteers at community events. Nesburg, who passed away in December 2016, was a beloved and well-known member of the Charlevoix area. Co-owner of Charlevoix Screen Masters with her husband Roger, Nesburg was a faithful and willing volunteer, donating her time, talents and treasures through years of service. She was actively involved with Girl Scout Troop 10253, Charlevoix's Venetian Week (spearheading 'Kids' Day), Montessori House, and her local church. Maurer and Nesburg exemplify the core values and mission of Zonta.
